# The Pattern of Our Days

The Book of Psalms is filled with prayers. Appropriately, it has been called the Church's Prayer Book. So if you want to learn to pray then this one of the best places to start.

Lots of suggestions have been made about how exactly we can start and learn to hear from God and respond to God. One way is simply to pray a Psalm a day starting with #1 and going through #150. Others have suggested praying five Psalms a day and praying through the book in a month.

For the next 7 weeks we are going to try a different pattern. We are going to pray a different Psalm for each day of the week. On Sundays we can pray through Psalm 92 and learn to open our mouths and hearts and lives to God in worship. Then on Mondays we will be invited to pray Psalm 19 and enter into creation as we cherish God's law. On Tuesday we will read and pray through Psalm 32. This is a blessing song that reminds us that we are blessed as we are forgiven. Half way through the week we can pray Psalm 23 to reorient our lives as followers of the Good Shepherd. Then on Thursdays as we begin to feel the weight of the week we can pray Psalm 51, the great confession and cleansing prayer of David. On Friday we can to the cross with Jesus and utter the words of Psalm 22 with him. And finally on Saturday we will read and pray and meditate on Psalm 25 as we seek the way of the Lord.

Living into this kind of rhythm and pattern isn't a quick fix for our broken hearts. It isn't an easy way to change everything in our worlds. But it is a way that we can lean to shape our days and grow together into the kind of people who know and speak to the Father with the Son in the power of the Spirit.
